## Publication of The Ryedale Plan: Local Plan Strategy (Development Plan Document)

The Ryedale Plan: Local Plan Strategy Development Plan Document (formerly known as the Core Strategy Development Plan Document) has now been published. This document is the version of the Plan which the Council proposes to submit to the Secretary of State for independent examination. Prior to this, the document is now available for consultation for a 6-week period from 25 January 2012 to 4.30pm 9 March 2012.

The Plan proposes key policies for managing growth and change across the District to 2027, and once adopted it will form part of the Development Plan for the District which will:

- Set out the amount of new housing, retail and employment development that will take place in different parts of the District
- Identify the type of development required to meet the needs of local communities
- Outline the types of changes that will happen at each of the five towns as well as the wider rural area
- List some of the projects and investment that will support and deliver the strategy
- Provide a framework to assist in the determination of planning applications

The document covers the area of Ryedale District which is outside the North York Moors National Park.

Please note that this document does not contain site specific proposals. New development sites will be included in another document that will be prepared as part of the Ryedale Plan, once the Local Plan Strategy has been agreed.
